Agnes Smedley lived in China from 1928 to 1942—the last five years in every-day contact with Chinese troops and peasants in their struggle against the Japanese. As correspondent for the Manchester Guardian and volunteer in the Chinese Red Cross Medical Corps, she became the friend of many Chinese democratic leaders, of Generals Stilwell and Chennault, and of the former British ambassador Sir Archibald Clark-Kerr. Few Americans have as intimate a familiarity with the Chinese people as Mrs. Smedley. She is their friend, co-worker, and champion, and she has lectured, raised money, and worked in hospitals and at the front in their behalf. Her vivid autobiography, "Daughter of Earth," has been published in thirteen languages.

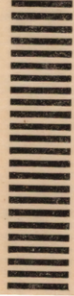
