WHO'S WHO

DR. GEORGE LAWTON, author of many scientific papers, is the editor of the book "New Goals for Old Age", author of "Aging Successfully", "Aging Creatively" (forthcoming) and "Counseling the Older Person" (forthcoming) — all under the imprint of the Columbia University Press.

He is a member of the editorial board of the Journal of Gerontology (gerontology — the study of aging in all its phases); divisional representative to the Section on Old Age and Adulthood of the American Psychological Association, instructor at Cooper Union, Town Hall, and at New York University; and a consultant to many organizations which are attempting to meet the psychological needs of older people. His work has been the subject of editorial comment in the Journal of the American Medical Association.

A Fellow of the American Psychological Association, the New York Academy of Science and the American Orthopsychiatric Association, Dr. Lawton is currently serving his second term of office as President of the Metropolitan New York Association of Applied Psychology.

Dr. Lawton has contributed articles to the Saturday Evening Post, American Magazine, Readers Digest, the Ladies Home Journal, has been a guest of We, the People, Adventures in Science, and most of the women's radio programs, and on January 2nd, will take part in the Town Meeting of the Air.
