THE story of the child's ensemble which Miss Agnes Smedley, author of "Hail, Hymn of China," and now at Yaddo, used as the prize in a special project to raise funds for the Chinese cultural workers seems to be a continued one.

The ensemble of exquisite workmanship was the handwork of Mrs. Aino Taylor of Ajax, Calif., whose father was Finnish, mother Swedish, her husband Scotch, and now a naturalized American citizen. Before coming to the States, the Taylors lived in Alaska.

Now the ensemble which was sent to Miss H. H. Young of New York, who had charge of the winning number of tickets, and who announced the ensemble was awarded to Mrs. Anna Heyl, a nurse serving at Doctor's Hospital in New York.

The nurse has sent the ensemble to her husband an American machine gunner, now in Belgium, with instructions for him to give it to some needy Belgian child, it will fit.

Many Saratogians who aided in the project are interested in its final disposition.
