blems." Chief functions of the AACIC will be to provide technical advice, and assistance with accounting, statistics and managerial analysis. They will also work to promote further interest in the movement. The three men in charge of the new committee are William Hsu, J. M. Tan and Frank Lem. Frank Lem is being brought out of occupied China and until he reaches Chungking his position is being filled by Meng Yung-Chien, former Director of the Northern Front Regional Headquarters of the C.I.C. They are all fine men, and capable. government

Rewi Alley has not held an official/position in C.I.C. for many months, but that does not mean that he isn't doing as much -- or even more -- for the movement than formerly. He is a member of the International Committee for Chinese Industrial Cooperatives Productive Relief Fund and receives his salary through that committee (from the U.S.) as head of the Indusco Services, and one of the two Field Secretaries. The other Field Secretary is Chen Han-seng. Indusco Services is made up of 16 technicians and engineers who develop new machines for the cooperatives, investigate raw materials, work out new processes of manufacture and give technical advice and assistance.

I hope that this answers the first part of your letter. When Miss Pruitt returns to the office she will write to you again to take up your other questions.
