Dear Anna:

Pardon me that I did not answer your letter before this, but I have been so very, very busy, that it was impossible. Thank you for urging me to return to America and working in the movement there. I talked with Margaret about such things when she was here. But you see, I am very political, and you might say very "Indian", in that India has been my work for so many years. It is my chief interest, and I would not like to undertake anything that did not bear on it, directly.

You will be glad for the Clinic here.
