

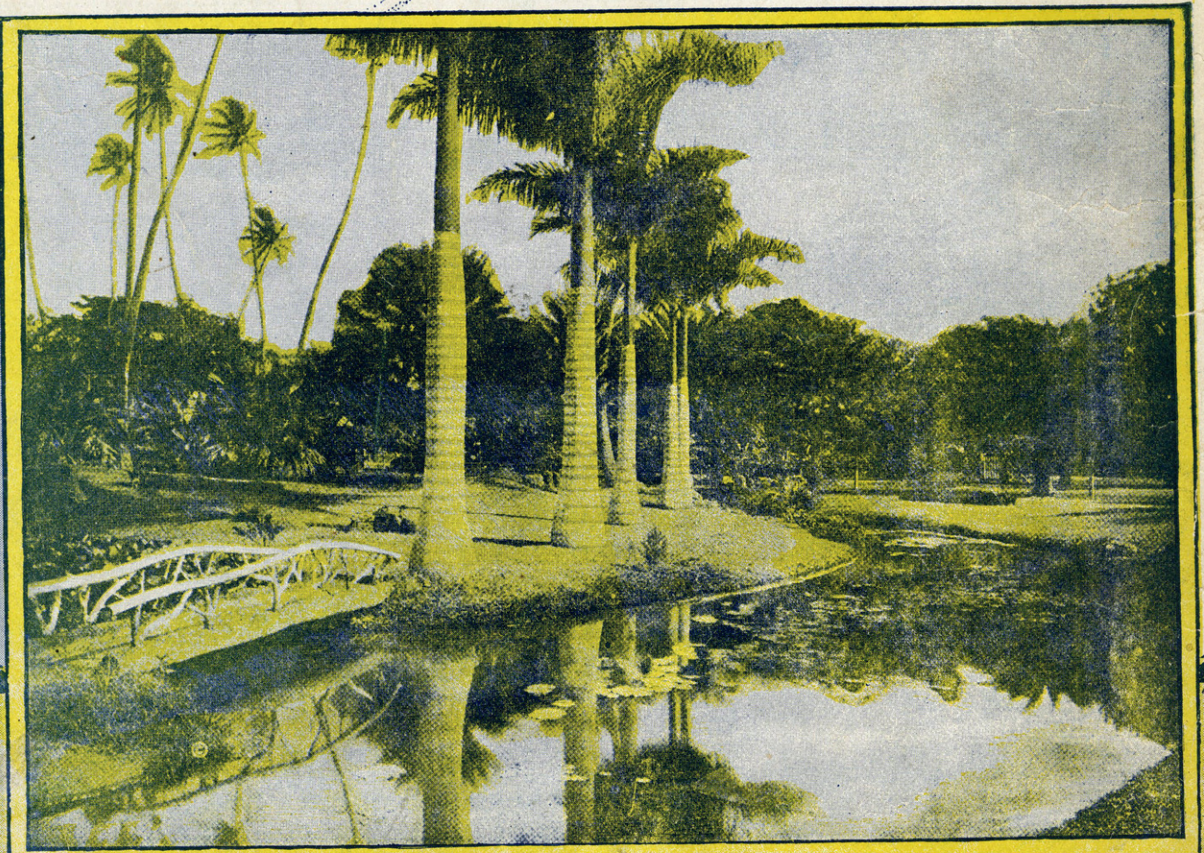

These records suggest the moonlight at Waikiki, the waving palms and the gentle zephyrs laden with the fragrance of flowers. Hear the numbers named below for we know you will want to add them to your library:

- NA LEI O HAWAII (Song of the Islands) Columbia Record No. 1686-D
The world-famous song that describes the floral wreaths of the Islands.
- IMI AU IA OE (King's Serenade) Columbia Record No. 1480-D
The song that grips you.
- PAAUUA WALTZ Columbia Record No. 1611-D
Acknowledged by a well-known critic as the best Hawaiian record he had heard.
- LEILEHUA (Wreath of Lehua) An interpretative hula Columbia Record No. 1458-D
Hawaiians love chorus singing and this record shows it.
- PUA ROSELANI (Rose of Maui) Columbia Record No. 1579-D
A fascinating waltz that tells of the charms of Maui.
- NIU HAOHAO (The Sweet Coconut) Columbia Record No. 1569-D
A typical song of Hawaii as sung by the Governor's special entertainers.
- HE ONO (It Tastes Good) Columbia Record No. 1582-D
This is the famous Hawaiian Fish Song.
- ALOHA OE (Queen Liliuokalani's Farewell Song) Columbia Record No. 1570-D
As played by the Royal Hawaiian Band on the arrival and departure of steamers from Honolulu.
- IMUA KAMEHAMEHA (Forward Kamehameha) Columbia Record No. 1568-D
Kamehameha School's football rally song.
- KE KALI NEI AU (Waiting For Thee) Columbia Record No. 1583-D
A special favorite with Hawaiian singers.
- HE NOHEA OE I KUU MAKI Columbia Record No. 1579-D
A favorite song with the serenaders of Hawaii.
