## Pennsylvania scatterbrain brings out cleaners

### New wallpaper slated for state's pressroom

More than two months after the suicide of Pennsylvania Treasurer R. Fudd Dyer, interior design crews are remodeling the now infamous pressroom in the state Finance Building.

Gray Matter, foreman of the clean-up crew hired to salvage the once tastefully-appointed conference room, said it took his crew almost seven weeks to uncover the soiled wallpaper, carpet and paneling.

Dyer died Jan. 22 after he fired a single shot from a .357 Magnum pistol into his mouth during a press conference. He was facing a 55-year prison sentence for defrauding the state.

Matter said he was forced to pay his workers overtime, resulting in a loss of \$30,000 for Pennsylvania tax payers.

## ASU investigates possible newsroom hazing

The *Stale Mess* is being investigated for a possible hazing incident this week after a reporter was taped to a chaise lounge, dangled from a second-story balcony at the newsroom and sprayed with water.

University officials said Biff Badpress, a freshman journalism major, was "strung up" by his city editor when he did not comply with the newspaper's 3:30 p.m. deadline.

"That little turd never could make deadline," the city editor said Wednesday. "Let them investigate. I don't care. I never liked him anyway."

"Besides, he can't even write. How can you expect him to be a tough journalist when he orders everything he wears out of the L.L. Bean catalog?"

Bruce Itolyou, adviser to the student publication, denied that the incident was hazing and told the students to "f--em."

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# Meekman whitewashes image, shows true colors

SOMEWHERE NEAR THE 7th AVENUE TRANSIENT CAMP — Arizona Gov. Eb Meekman revealed Tuesday that he actually is black and announced plans to declare a statewide holiday honoring Sammy Davis Jr.

Meekman, who has paraded as a white, conservative Glendale Republican for 25 years, said he is not a Republican, but rather a registered member of the Free Love and Optional Bondage Party.

Meekman also announced plans to join the Capitol press corps when his term is over.

Meekman said he regrets not telling voters about his true identity, but added he was concerned he would lose the gubernatorial race to independent candidate Bull Shlitz and Democrat Carolyn "Spin My Bun" Mourner.

"It bees dat way sometime," Meekman said. "They always be doin' dat discrimatin' stuff."

Meekman said he plans to declare a holiday for Sammy Davis Jr. because the black entertainer "ain't never had no trouble with the PO-lice."

The governor, who has been called a racist, said he was able to carry on the charade because of his well-designed, overtly Anglo costume of a polyester suit and hairpiece.

"I really did look like a white car dealer," Meekman said. "Nobody else dresses that tacky."

He said he even fooled his wife, Flo Meekman. Mrs. Meekman said she was concerned about her husband but never suspected he was black.

"I did always wonder why he called our seven children pickaninnies," she said. "But he always did it in such a loving, affectionate way I just thought it was his

own cute little saying."

Ron Ring-My-Bells, a Meekman spokesman, said he was surprised to learn that Meekman was black. But he admitted he was suspicious of the governor after finding two Aretha Franklin albums, a tube of Afro-Sheen and a copy of "Roots" in Meekman's office.

Meekman aide Jim Stupor said he knew that Meekman was not white and tried to tell reporters that the governor was trying to fool constituents.

"But those media scums wouldn't believe me," he said. "I kept telling them 'Eb is really black,' but they misquoted me and it ended up 'the earth is really flat' in the newspaper."

The governor also pledged to restore "personhoods" to all members of the Capitol press corps, but he said he regrets that he has no power to issue the reporters personalities.

# Smurfy, Dump miffed, lay \$300 million suit on ASU

Disassociated Students presidential hopeful Dill Smurfy and Limp and Giddy Academic Union co-chair Deenie Dump opened the latest chapter in the DSASU "suit-fest" Tuesday by filing a \$300 million lawsuit against ASU.

The suit names the Arizona Bored of Rejects, ASU President J. Russell Half-Nelson, and all 40,000 ASU students and faculty members as defendants.

The suit specifically alleges that College of Business Sen. Ron Cobloombow, College of Liberal Arts Sen. Mack Iceberg and DSASU Activities Vice President Pristine Sloth conspired to deprive Smurfy and the LGAU of their rights as guaranteed under the First and Fourteenth Amendments.

The suit was prompted by the actions of Cobloombow, Iceberg and Sloth, who introduced Senate Bill 666 last week. The measure banned all "subversive, fascist, ugly, trouble-makin' vermin" from participating in campus politics.

Cobloombow said: "I guess Dill and Deenie were upset

because we passed legislation directly aimed at them. Oh well, God be blessed."

He then dropped to his knees, murmuring Ronald Reagan's social security number reverently.

Smurfy said Executive Vice President Fidget Meltin, well known for strutting around the DSASU offices clad in leather while cracking her whip, was named in the suit for being "just too cute for words."

DSASU President Crass Comeseeme also was named for "being the only man on campus who spurts more fertilizer than a herd of wild beasts."

Smurfy said, "The rest of the students were cited for displaying their ignorance by not voting for me and for having bad haircuts."

The DSASU offices were in turmoil yesterday after word of the lawsuit was announced.

Iceberg was seen limping from office to office screaming, "Not again, not again!" while Cobloombow muttered evilly

in the Senate chambers and a shattered Comeseeme wept quietly in the corner.

Meltin was forced to whip several senators into unconsciousness when they tried to burn effigies of Smurfy and Dump.

"We're going for the big bucks!"

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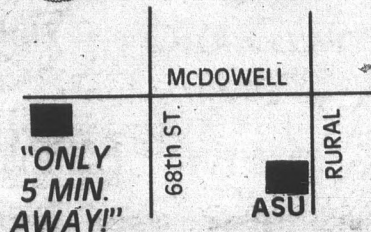
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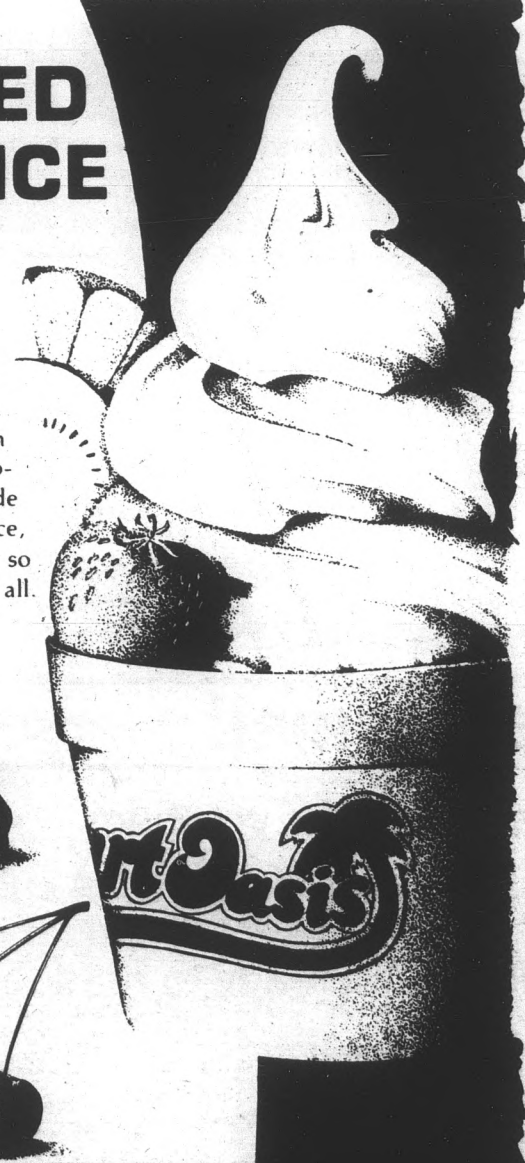
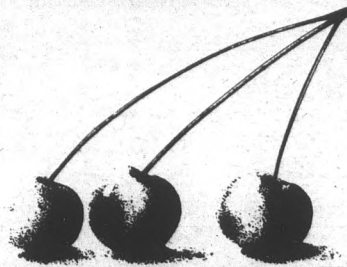
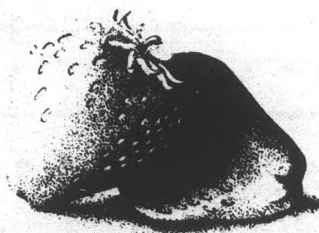
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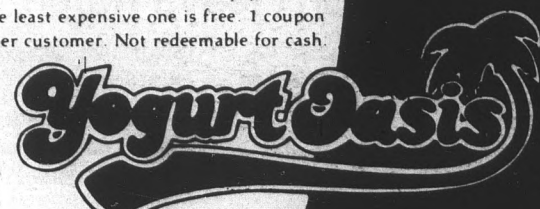

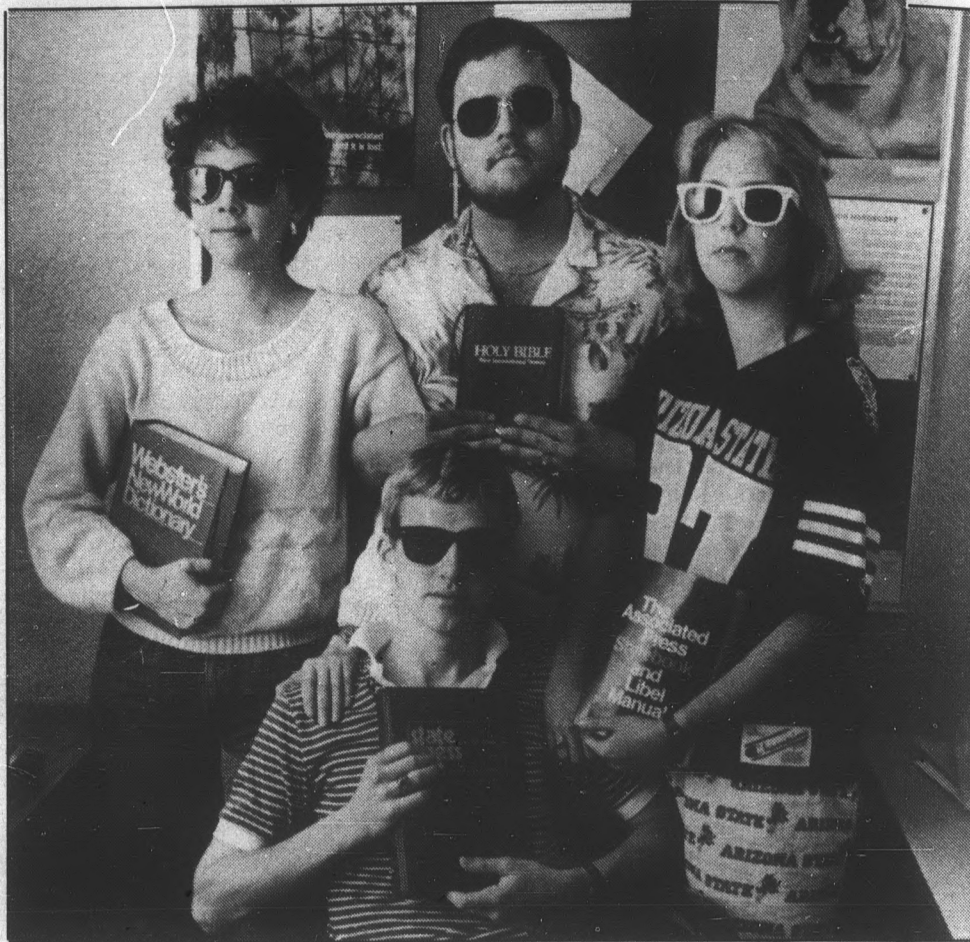

# STIFF contra funding scam busted, Meltin freaks out

# Center to continue trivial pursuits at research park

ASU Research Park officials announced Tuesday that the Center for Trivial Purchasing Studies has signed a lease with the park and will relocate its offices there.

Both sides hailed the move as a step forward.

"The relocation of the center into our park now gives us enough tenants that we have to use two hands to count them all," Lawrence Sunangel, president of the park's board of directors, said. "The trivial purchasing studies center will add to the already quality research being done here. Now if only the business community will take note, we might get to use our toes."

The center's director, Jack Habansnazen, expressed equal satisfaction with his new headquarters.

"This place is perfect for us," he said. "Our top two researchers are nervous types, and they don't like a lot of noise. The park here is really quiet."

ASU President J. Russell Half-Nelson said having the center at ASU's park will add to the University's prestige.

"Some of our business professors consulted with center researchers on the center's last study," he said. "The knowledge gained by those professors, who as a result of their work are at the cutting edge of their field, already is being transferred to students in ASU classes."

The center's last study just was published in a scholarly purchasing journal, which students can read in the Hayden Library's current periodicals section.

The study was titled, "The Conservation of Nickels by Consumers Using Coca-Cola

Vending Machines."

Habansnazen said the two-year study, conducted with the use of ASU vending machines that charged 45 cents, concluded that people buying soft drinks from the machines used two quarters consistently.

The consumers then would save the nickel change until the process had been repeated four times, he said. On the fifth purchase, the consumers had enough nickels to make exact change.

Habansnazen said he was not upset that the price of Coke at ASU had risen five more cents last semester, to 50 cents, because the study was finished.

"You got to make a buck," he said. "No one knows that better than researchers."

Half-Nelson said several ASU professors already were alluding to the exciting study in their lectures, but added that only the

professors who actually consulted on the study were using the material.

Habansnazen said the center's first work at the park site will be a case study of how Kentucky Fried Chicken made grease appealing to consumers by using the slogan, "Finger-lickin' good."

"The study will be of immediate benefit to ASU in that it will have ramifications upon Saga Foods," he said.

In a related announcement, Sunangel said while the park has vacancies, the ASU football team will move its practice site to the 323-acre park located near the Tempe-Chandler border.

"We know the team will be a big drawing card for local businesses, and we sure have got enough recreational facilities," Sunangel said. "We beat Tontozona all to hell."

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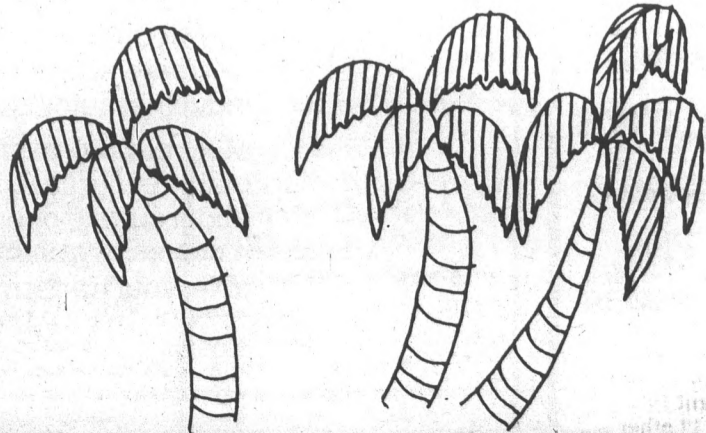

"The good Lord knows how much can be done in his name through persuasive suggestion," he said. "The ends justify the means."

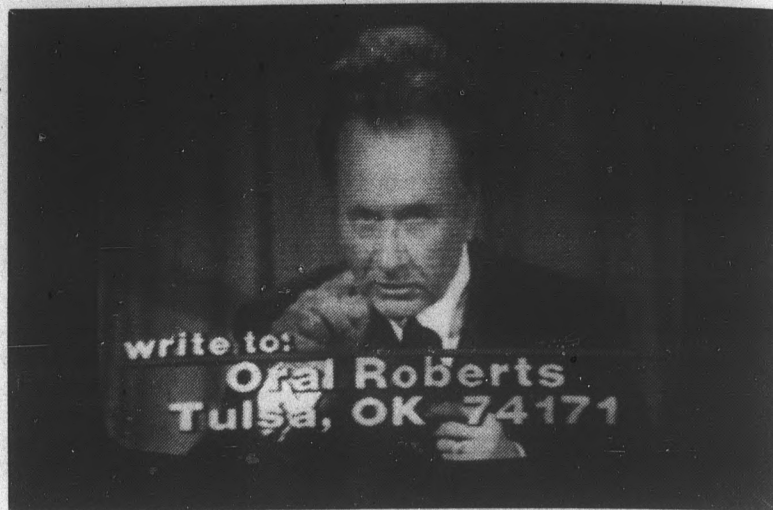
Roberts said God thought the bickering over controlling interest in Rev. Jim Bakker's recently toppled PTL organization was "petty."

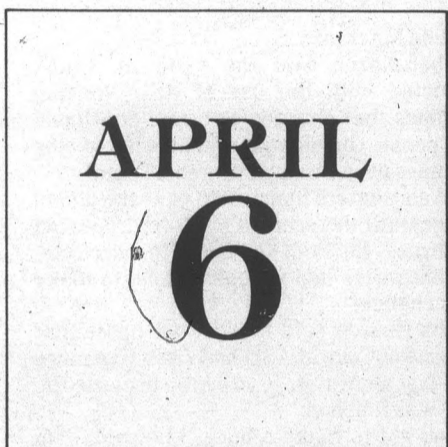
But at least one skateboarder is upset over the new policy.

"This is bogus," 15-year-old Ivan Attitude said.

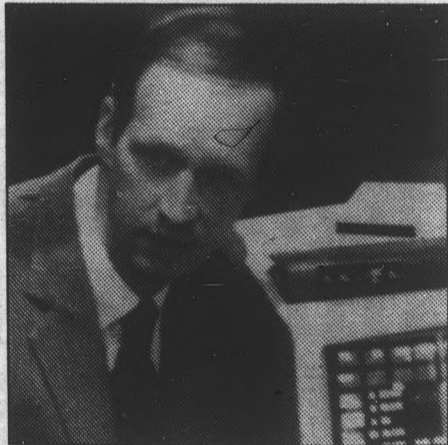

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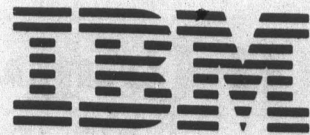

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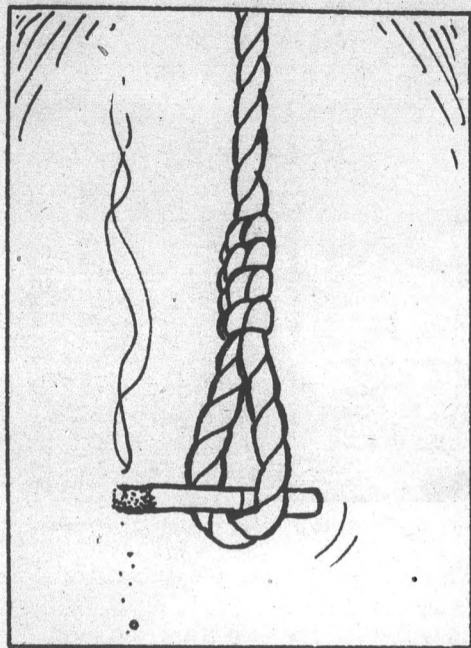
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# Rising sexologist says Orgasm Week sucked

ASU's director of student health has been diagnosed as having Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome, or AIDS, by doctors at Tempe St. Luke's Hospital.

Dr. Ben Dover Encoff was rushed to the hospital on Tuesday with chronic coughing, hemorrhaging and extremely dark circles beneath his eyes.

Encoff was diagnosed as being in the advance stages of the AIDS disease and is not expected to live through the National Gay Doctors Convention to be held in San Francisco Aug. 4.

Encoff said he was drinking boysenberry Kamikazes at a local bar and met with a torrid love affair.

"I should have known better," he said. "I should have used a condom."

"But you know what happens during the throes of passion — you just forget."

Encoff said as soon as he is released from the hospital, he will start a campuswide quest to have condom machines installed in men's and women's bathrooms.

"I see no conflict of interest between my disease and my job," he said, unwrapping the newest arrival of measles vaccinations.

ASU President J. Russell Half-Nelson said Encoff's position with the University currently is under review.

"It's an under-the-cover issue if you know what I mean," he said. "Issues like this should be handled very delicately — and preferably with rubber gloves."

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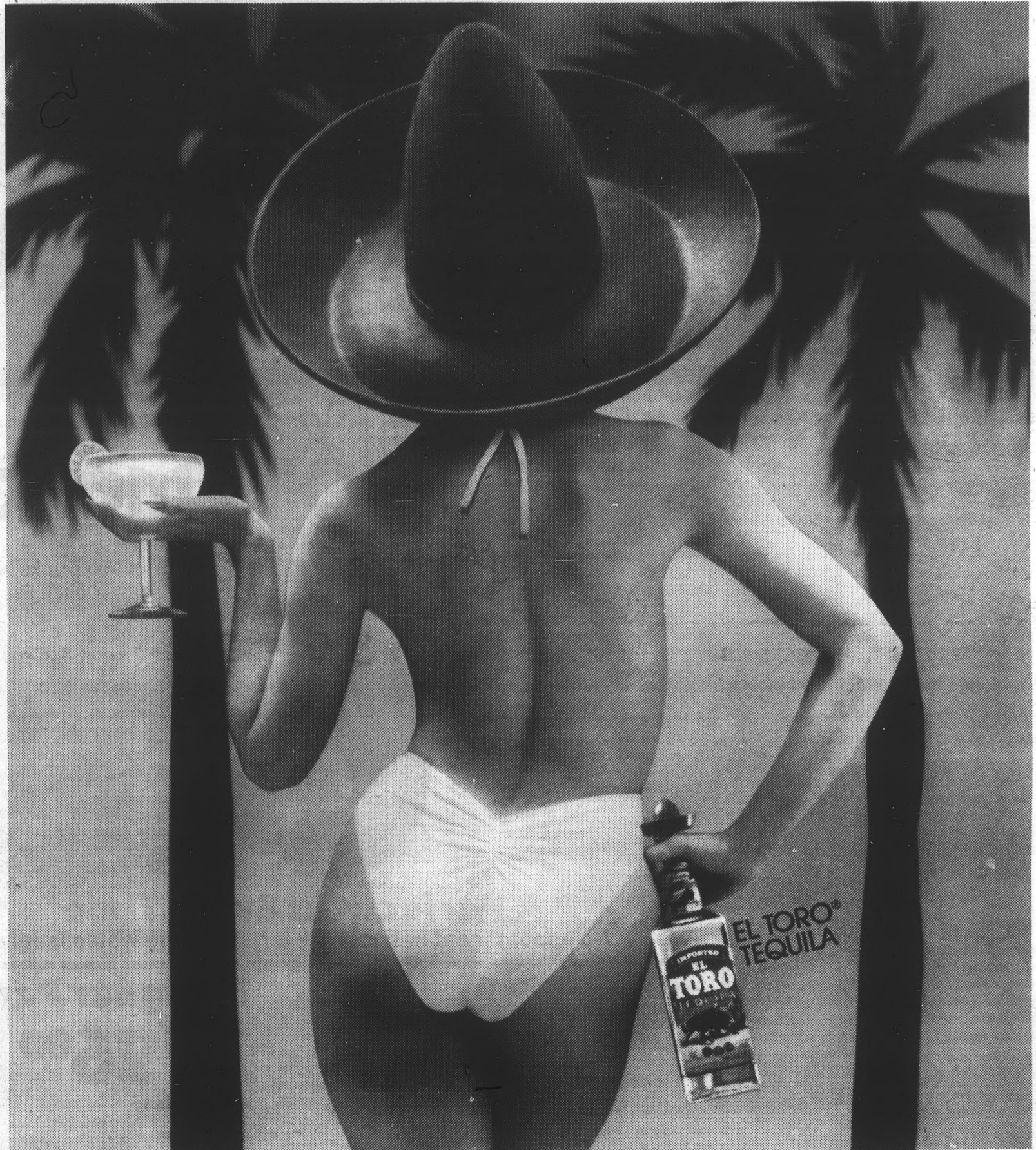
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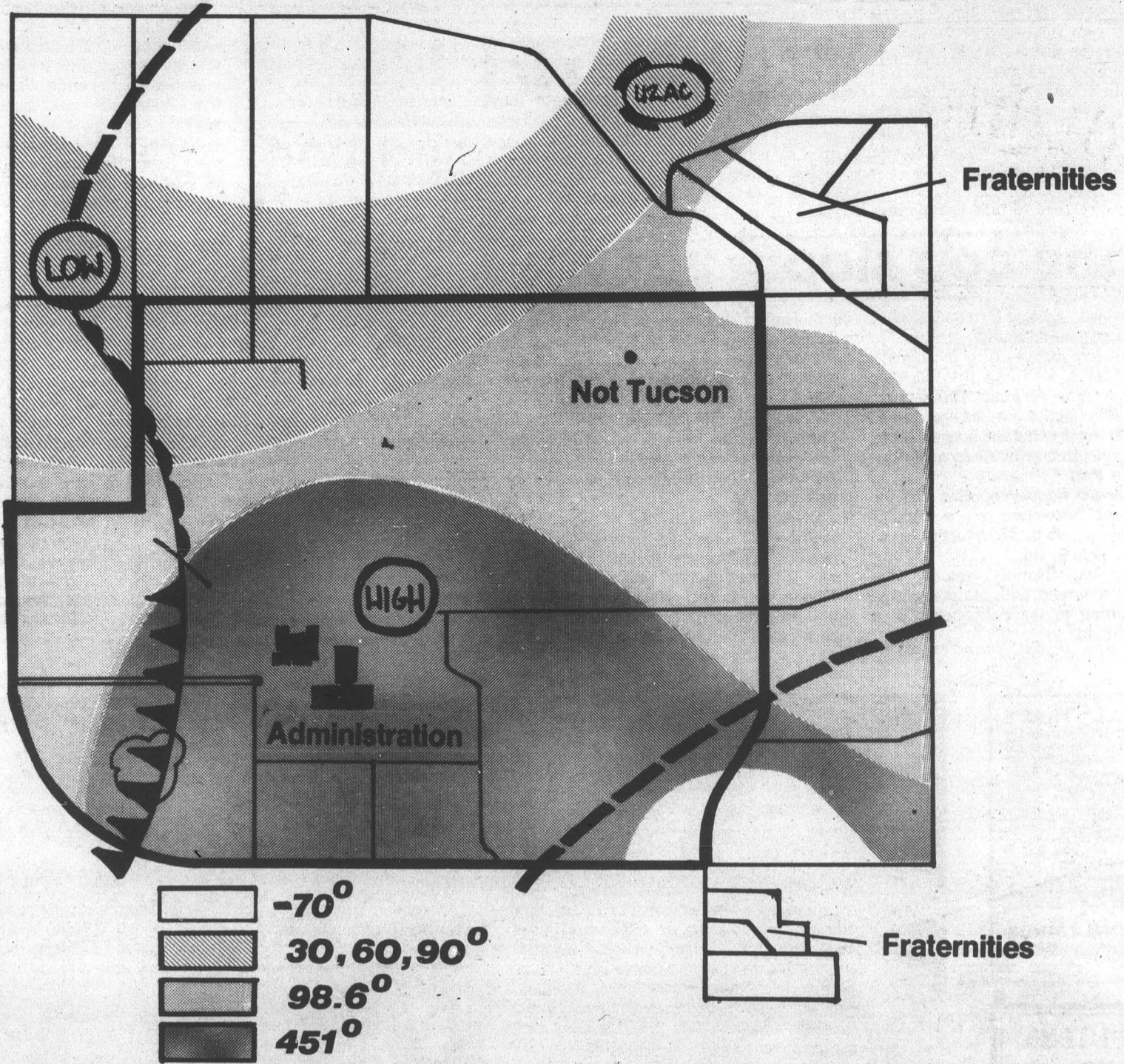

**Malmsteen:** Hey, the British influence is really noticeable in this business. Call it keeping up with the Durans.

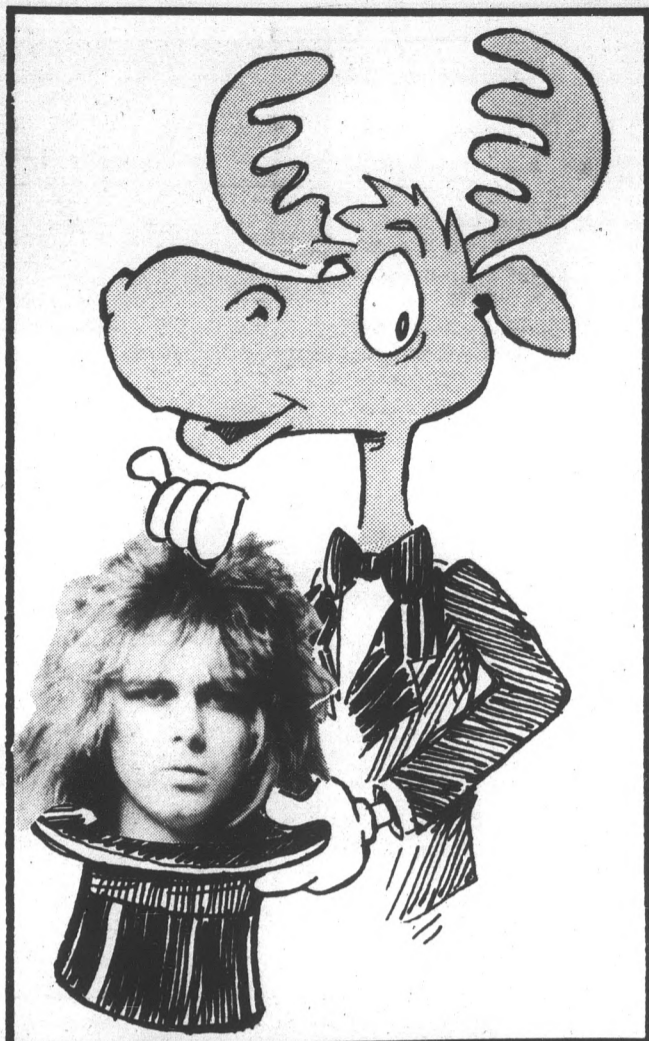
The Nair is American, although I often have to redo my ankles and toes.

**Malmsteen:** I don't know, really. Somewhere with a rich musical tradition. Maybe Ohio.



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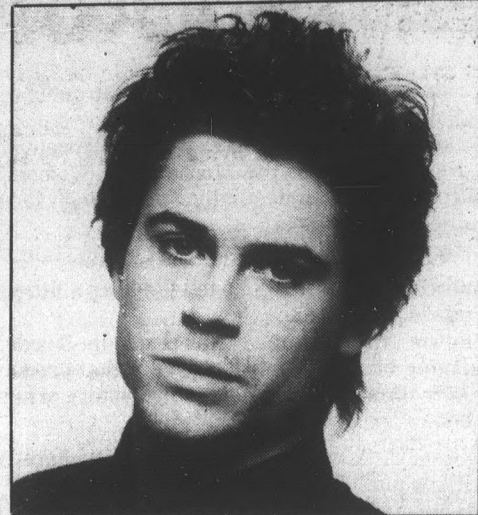
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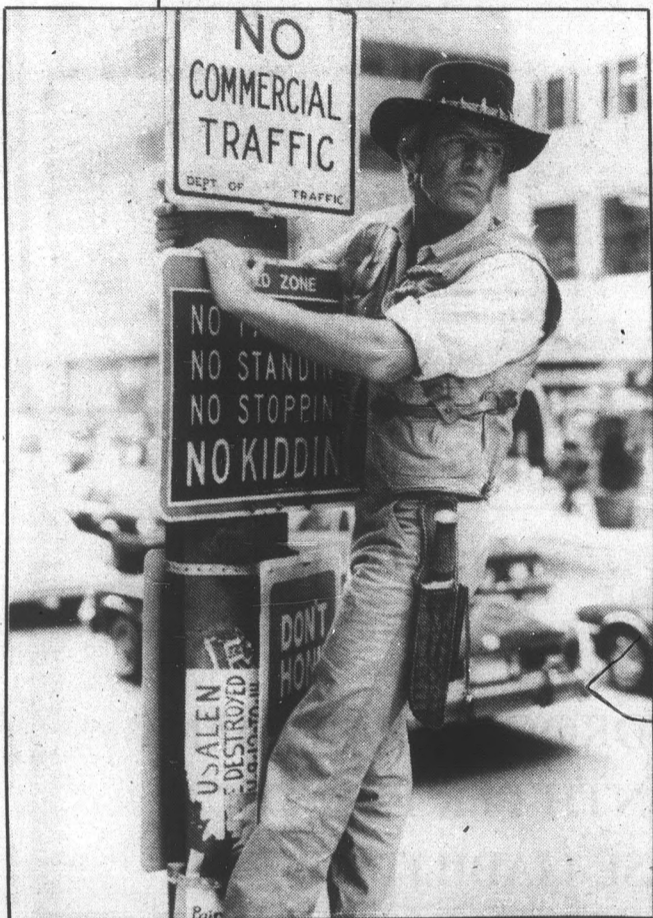

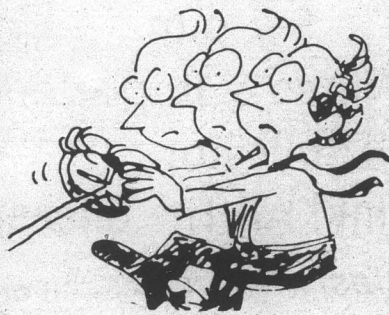
My God, what have we done? What transgression of the laws of the universe have we made in committing this monster to vinyl? Is there anyway to stop it?

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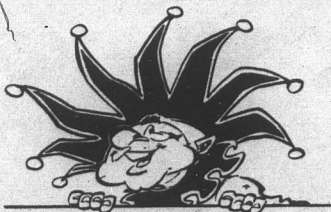
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## Splice

### Doctors try experiment, create perfect hoopster

In an experimental cloning procedure, the athletic department has created a combination of ASU center Tarre Isiah and point guard Arthur Thomas.

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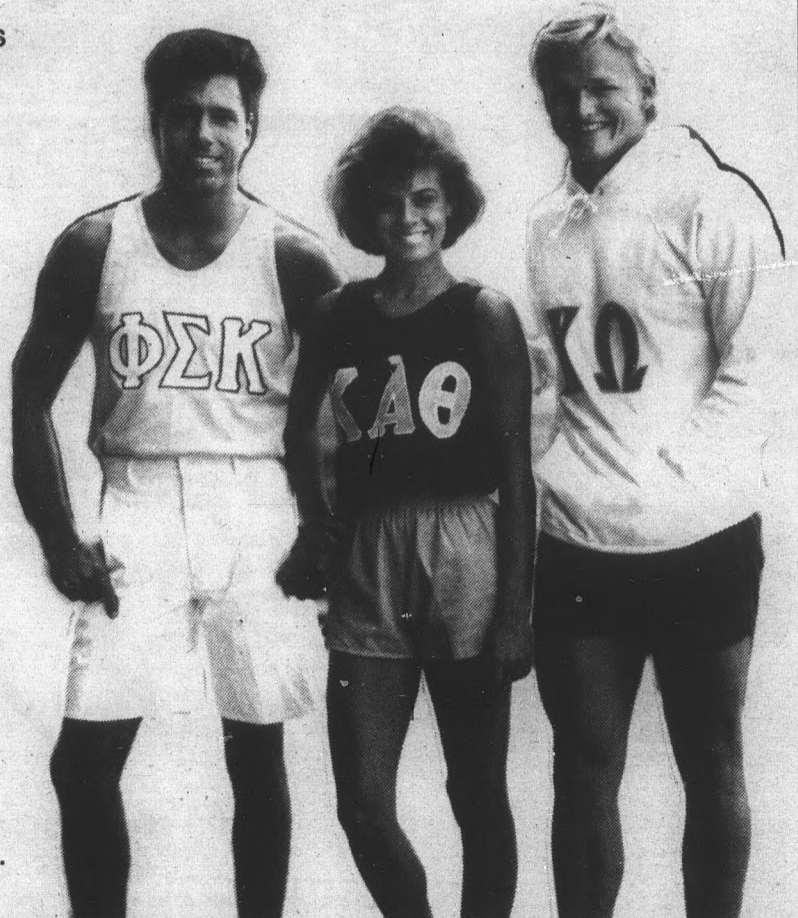

## Stale Mess sports editors film commercial, get jailed for fighting with basketball greats

Two *Stale Mess* sports editors were arrested for public lewdness and drunkenness last night following a complaint by Tempe residents saying "those two sportswriters were fighting with an old man and a basketball player," Tempe police said.

The complaint was filed against Seig Heiler, *Stale Mess* sports editor and his sports urine analyst, Thad Obenauer, for fighting behind a Tempe bar with former UCLA basketball coach John Wooden and Los Angeles Laker Earvin "Magic" Johnson.

"There they were, clothes all torn up, beating the daylights out of each other," police spokesman Steve Roids said. "Heiler looked like he was holding his own with the old guy, but Obenauer was getting pummeled."

The four men had apparently just finished shooting a beer commercial and gone on a bar-hopping spree on rollerskates. Witnesses said there was a fifth man involved, apparently a bartender at *Shepherd's* bar on Rural Road.

"It's all hype," Heiler said. "We were just out for some greyhounds (a cocktail made with vodka and grapefruit juice) and got into a little wrestling match."

The four are to be featured in a commercial for Budweiser, which is an attempt to answer the successful campaign of Miller Lite.

Obenauer, known for his flamboyant behavior among local press circles, said, "I thought those guys would be cool, especially Magic."

"But Seig said something about Pac-10 basketball being weak, and he and Wooden started brawling," he said.

Heiler and Obenauer were booked into the

Tempe city jail without bail for an unannounced period of time.

"We're hoping to keep them here as long as we can," Roids said. "We're sports fans, and we're just a little sick of the meaningless tripe they call journalism."

Wooden and Johnson refused to comment, but in a prepared statement said, "We wish we never would have hooked up with those two guys at the Pac-10 tournament."

A similar incident took place in Watts, a suburb of Los Angeles, last month when Heiler and Obenauer were rolled in an alley after a few too many mobile cocktails. *Stale Mess* photographer Ron Kujo was nearby taking spot news photos of area transients.

Both journalists have been barred from all press conferences, with emphasis on those given by ASU basketball coach Sleeve Scatterbrain.

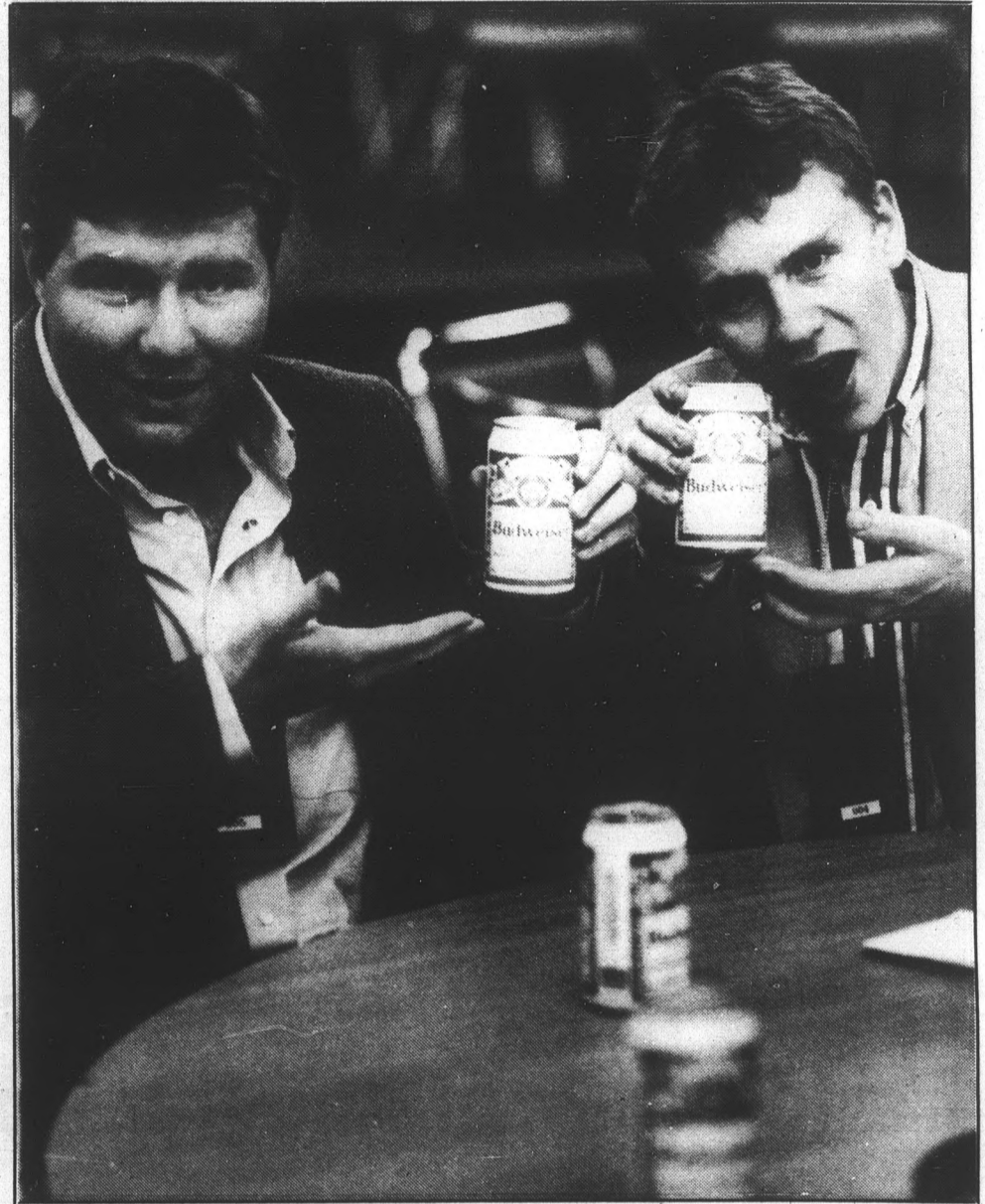
Heiler said as he sat in his drunk tank at the Tempe jail, "They're all going down . . . hard!!!"

Anheuser-Busch, the corporation that produces Budweiser, has disassociated itself from Heiler and Obenauer, claiming that their contracts have been violated and that film crews can't be expected to work inside a prison, or a hospital, which is where Obenauer was taken to treat severe lacerations, contusions and alcohol poisoning.

"Those boys are in some serious trouble," said Spuds MacKenzie, spokesman for Budweiser. "I've been down that road before. Ever since Dino left the kennel we grew up in, he's been off on the wrong paw."

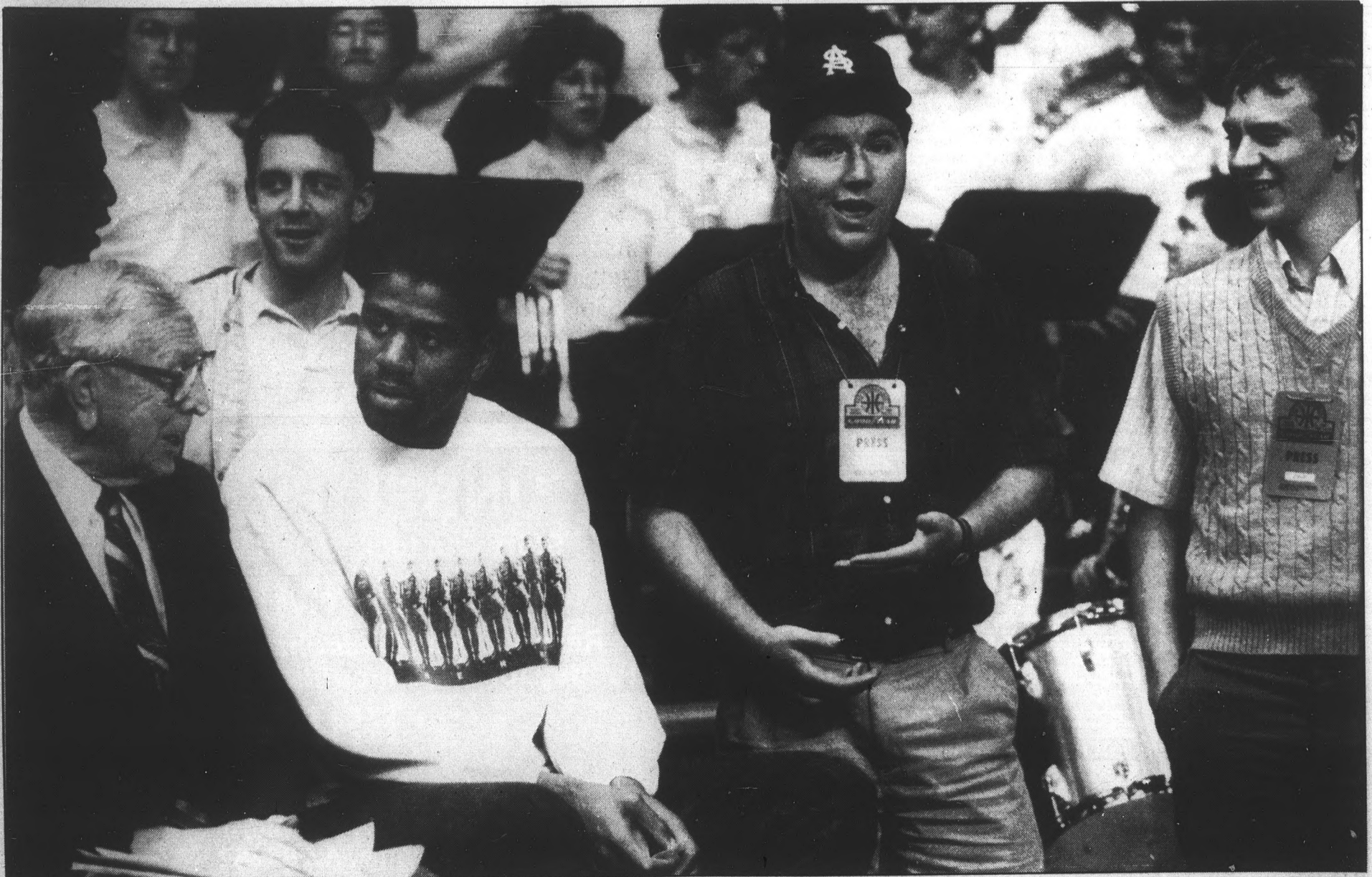
MacKenzie licked his stomach for a while, bit his flank and returned to the conversation.

## Phoenix hoop coach to fill vacancy for Devils

ASU announced Tuesday that John Darkcloud has been hired to replace Sleeve Scatterbrain as head coach of the ASU basketball team.

Scatterbrain was released earlier in the day when he said he refused to coach in any league Hooker Turnpike was officiating.

Darkcloud, fired earlier this season as head coach of the Phoenix Guns, said he was happy to be remaining in the Valley and was looking forward to bringing the Sun Devils to next year's Final Four in Kansas City, Mo.

Scatterbrain, 25-31 in his two-year career at ASU, is rumored to be high on the list to fill the vacancy for the Guns coaching position, currently being held by interim coach Dick Van Boring, former radio announcing partner to Al Obnoxious.

Darkcloud becomes only the eighth head coach at ASU since the University began a basketball program in 1933.

ASU athletic director Gnarled Hairless said the actual hiring was performed by *State Mess* sports editor Seig Heiler.

"I felt that Seig had the knowledge to choose a worthy successor for Scatterbrain," Hairless said. "We wanted some student input as we are hoping for a sell-out season in all sports next year — not just football.

"The athletic department is hoping to sell more than 5,000 student season tickets for basketball next year, and we will be handing out gold pompons at all games next year. We're really excited about it."

Hairless said Heiler's numerous columns

about the Sun Devil basketball team seemed to make more sense than the columns about other sports.

"I knew where he was coming from," Hairless said. "I discussed (Heiler's) suggestions with one of my good buddies in Boston (Nordics head coach K.C. Jones).

"K.C. said the ideas would probably work and suggested we just hire Seig as the head coach, but I thought that would cause too much controversy."

Heiler declined comment on his selection of Darkcloud, but did say, "Maybe now we'll get more ASU fans in the Inactivity Center than UA fans for THE GAME."

Darkcloud — who was in his 14th year as head coach of the Guns before being fired — compiled an overall record of 579-542 as the mentor of the Madhouse on McDowell and brought the Guns to the NBA Finals in 1976 before losing to the Boston Nordics in a memorable seven-game series.

"With all the assists that Arthur Thomas has dishd out, and all the points Dark Casino has scored in the paint, I think we'll have a competitive team next year," Darkcloud said.

ASU ticket office manager Dyin' Yeager said the ticket office started receiving "thousands" of calls as soon as it was announced Darkcloud would be coaching the Sun Devils.

"Most people have been wanting to know if they can just transfer their season tickets from the Coliseum (where the Guns play) to the Inactivity Center," Yeager said.

"Right now we're just telling them to hold on to their Guns tickets. Maybe we'll have a lottery."

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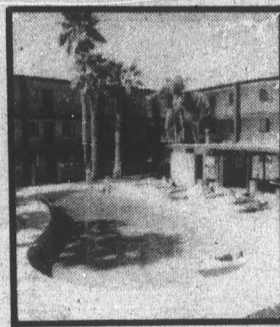
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# Dark cloud opens door for return of Alltheway

Former ASU forward Takeit Alltheway, whose mottled past with the team ended last season with former coach Sleeve Scatterbrain's dismissal, may be back again, like a bad case of acne.

Scatterbrain had announced that "the door was open" for Alltheway to return to the team, because he "deserved a second chance."

Darkcloud said he is going to start a massive weight training and steroid program among team members, so that all his players will be "tougher than a two dollar steak" before the 1987-88 season begins.

"We're going to really do some damage out there," Darkcloud said. "This team has problems with winning and with filling the Inactivity Center, and I figure a little gore will go a long way toward solving both of those."

Asked what team he wanted to pattern the new-look Sun Devils after, Darkcloud answered without hesitation:

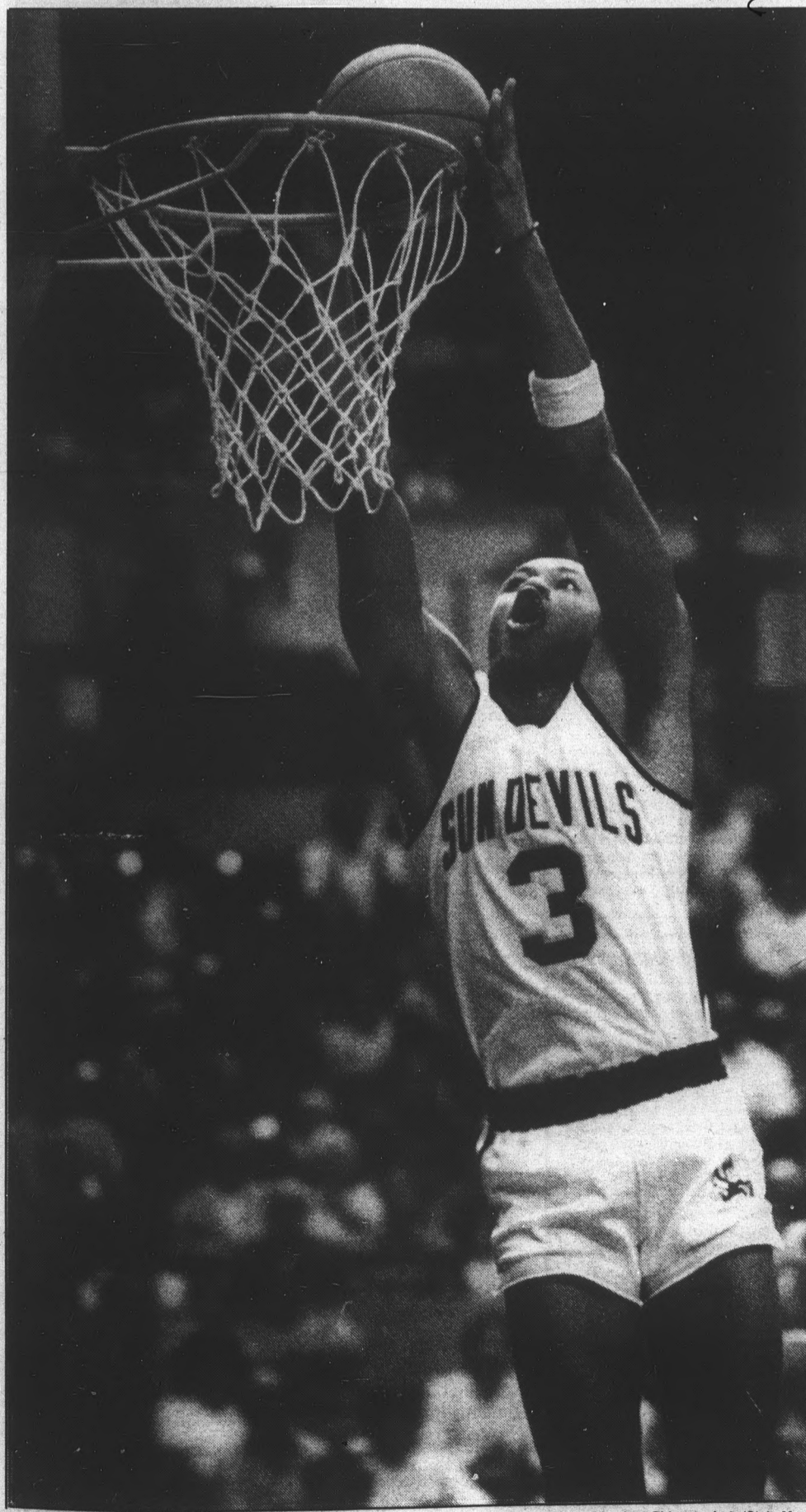

Finesse forward Alex Jordanlite is one player uncertain as to what the new direction holds for him.

"I don't know what he wants from me," Jordanlite said. "I'm used to playing the perimeter game, not mixing it up too much."

"I don't know what to do. First Scatterbrain plays me in the high post all season and now I've got to take drugs that make me sterile."
