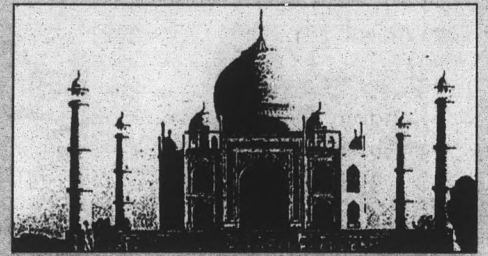

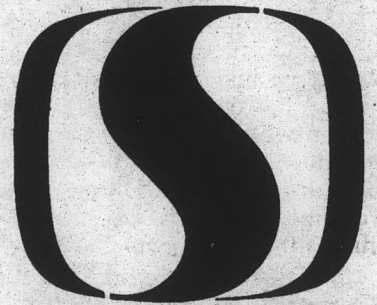

Nick of Time

On a normal afternoon for accountant Gene Watson (Johnny Depp), the minutes and hours pass with little notice or concern. Not today.

He is about to experience the sort of drama that holds morbid fascination when splashed across the news. Random chance has just placed him in on of those horrific, incredulous situations.

Arriving at Union Station in downtown Los Angeles for an appointment, Gene and his six-year-old daughter Lynn (Courtney Chase) are suddenly taken hostage by police impostors (Christopher Walken and Roma Maffia). Gene is told he must commit a murder within the next 90 minutes or his daughter will die. The target of his deadly assignment is an innocent public figure (Marsha Mason). Any effort Watson makes to go to the authorities is stymied by the sure knowledge that the kidnappers will retaliate by killing his daughter. In his frantic race against the clock, each moment has quick and deadly consequences.

Starring Johnny Depp and Christopher Walken, the action-filled suspense thriller "Nick of Time" runs in real time: Director-producer John Badham has constructed the film's length to be nearly identical with the time span of events taking place in the movie. Written by Patrick Sheane Duncan, the film also stars Charles S. Dutton, Peter Strauss, Roma Maffia, Gloria Reube and Marsha Mason. D.J. Caruso is the executive producer of the presentation of the Motion Picture Group of Paramount Pictures, part of the entertainment operations of Viacom Inc.

At the wrong place at the wrong time, Gene Watson is confronted with the most profound and frightening situation imaginable. A quiet accountant and devoted father, his courage and wits will be tested in a singular, harrowing ordeal. The kidnapper's insane but compelling plan will implicate Watson with a Zapruder-like home video in which he will appear to be an unhinged loner bent on some deranged revenge.

John Badham observes, "Nearly every day the newspaper recounts incredulous but true incidents that are as unfathomable as they are tragic. Such stories repeatedly demonstrate that the truth is

much stranger than fiction. Most people expect each day of the week to unfold much like the one before. Yet every single day there are those who will experience something so unexpected or shocking that they



can't even accept the fact that it is happening - and it's happening to them."

"This is the situation faced by Johnny Depp's character, an ordinary man who gets caught up in extraordinary circumstances that are horrible and beyond his control," says John Badham, whose films include "Point of No Return," "Stakeout," "WarGames" and "Saturday Night Fever." "This situation could happen to any of us. 'Nick of Time' puts before the filmgoer the terrifying question, 'What would you do if this happened to you?'"

Adds executive producer D.J. Caruso, "Because his role in 'Nick of Time' is very different from what we've seen Johnny do in the past, the audience will be rooting for him even as they whether he can be the hero."

Depp is a three-time Best Actor Golden Globe nominee for "Ed Wood," "Benny & Joon" and "Edward Scissorhands." In comparison to some of the unusual characters he has portrayed, Depp plays a remarkably ordinary protagonist in "Nick of Time." Observes Depp, "Gene goes from one extreme to another - from one emotion to the next - in the fraction of a second. To play the role I drew on what's accessible, and family is very important to me, I have nieces and nephews that I absolutely worship. If anything ever happened to them, I would go crazy and do anything to save them."

The film's stunt coordinator, Shane Dixon ("Drop Zone," "Little Rascals"), observes that "Nick of Time" warrants Depp "action actor" status; "Johnny did 90% of his own stunts, including fight scenes and a 90-foot cable fall."

In consideration of the real time nature of the movie and the performances, nearly all of the film was shot in sequential order on location, with some additional filming on soundstages.

Gene Watson's nemesis in "Nick of Time" - the cunning Mr. Smith - is played by Christopher Walken, an Academy Award winner for "The Deer Hunter" and most recently seen in "Batman Returns" and "Pulp Fiction."

Walken says of his character, "Mr. Smith is a terrorist, a terrible man. Of course, I couldn't think about that while doing the role. I had to think he's just doing his job."

Says director Badham, "Christopher Walken plays a hunter with an animal in his sights. Because of his enormous talent and charisma he is able to texture the part of a bad guy and make him an interesting, more fully-rounded human being."

Co-starring as Huey, a hotel employee enlisted to help Gene Watson, is Charles S. Dutton, whose films include "Menace II Society," "Rudy" and "Alien3." Dutton found working in a realistic time frame an extraordinary experience, remarking, "It adds a sense of heightened urgency not only to the acting but to the physical production demands."

Dutton reflects on Gene's predicament, "You do what has to be done to save your family. Like Gene, I would also hope to find someone like Huey to help me."

Eleanor Grant, the intended assassination tar-

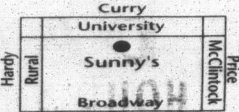

get, is played by Marsha Mason, a four-time Best Actress Academy Award nominee for "Only When I Laugh," "Chapter Two," "The Goodbye Girl" and "Cinderella Liberty."

Asked how she would react if placed in Watson's grave situation, Mason replies, "I would be feeling exactly the same way and doing exactly the same thing. I think people will identify with, and experience, Gene's emotional crisis. The tension accelerates frame by frame."

Grant's debonair husband is played by Peter Strauss (Emmy winner for "The Jericho Mile," Emmy nominee for "Kane and Abel"). Says Strauss, "If you allow yourself to be swept along with the premise of this complex dilemma, you'll realize every person that encounters Gene Watson could be in on the plot and there really is no one to help him."

Also co-starring in "Nick of Time" are Roma Maffia ("Disclosure," "The Paper") as Ms. Jones, the ruthless cohort of Mr. Smith; and Gloria Reuben ("Timecop," TV series "ER") as Krista Brooks, the

Governor's executive assistant. The cast includes Courtney Chase (TV series "Blossom") as Gene's six-year-old daughter Lynn; Bill Smitrovich (TV series "Life Goes On"), and G.D. Spradlin ("Ed Wood," "The Godfather, Part II").

ABOUT THE PRODUCTION

In creating a story of a man chosen at random to commit a murder, screenwriter Patrick Sheane Duncan was inspired by the idea of creating a film premise that could be depicted in a realistic time frame. The 'actual time' technique has been utilized for other films, most notably in Hitchcock's 1948 psychological thriller "Rope," filmed like a play on one basic set.

Director John Badham selected a quasi-documentary style for "Nick of Time," explaining, "Our film was shot as if we just happened upon these people and their circumstances. The actors were filmed without make-up using hand-held cameras to achieve a raw, realistic feeling."

"A documentary is shot with the knowledge

that you have one shot to get it right, so you can't always put the camera exactly where you would like. You can't always be in focus. Sometimes you're too far or too close to the action. The lighting isn't always perfect or flattering to your subject. That is the illusion we tried to create."

Commenting on this less rigidly choreographed shooting style, Johnny Depp says it was an invigorating and instructional process.

"We did a lot of scenes that involved two or three cameras, which reduced the number of takes and kept a freshness and spontaneity to the acting," he says. "You're not bound within frame lines and feel like you can go anywhere and do anything."

Filming in real time is itself a unique challenge, requiring a director to tell an almost seamless story without the time-span jumps so common in most films. As it does in "Nick of Time," locations in the story must be in close proximity to insure authenticity.

"You can't skip or take shortcuts through

transitions and mundane aspects of a story, such as when a guy is seen leaving his office in one scene and then seen walking through the front door in the next," explains Eadham. "In this situation we have to stay with Depp's character wherever he goes and at the same time, keep the pace moving."

During principal photography from April 2 through June 19, the major location was the Westin Bonaventure Hotel in the heart of downtown Los Angeles and only a few blocks from Union Station.

Says director of photography Roy H. Wagner, A.S.C. ("Drop Zone," "Another Stakeout"), "The place is a giant maze. We tried to create a look like an M.C. Escher drawing, in which you're never quite sure where you are. There is no perspective. Stairways appear to go nowhere and the laws of form don't quite fit."

"To light scenes for a documentary texture, we desaturated and decolorized to give everything a harsher and colder feel. It isn't the romanticized look of L.A. seen in most films. The dynamics of light to

dark are more aggressive and cruel."

Production designer Philip Harrison ("Point of No Return," "Mississippi Burning") and set director Julia Badham ("Point of No Return," "Another Stakeout") modified Bonaventure Hotel interiors in a variety of subtle ways to create suspense in Gene Watson's deadly race against the clock. A hotel shoe-shine stand and near-by plant shop were constructed with transparent glass, while clocks were strategically placed to offer stark reminders that Gene's time is running out.

The hotel's famous glass elevators were utilized for several scenes, with Harrison recreating one of these imposing structures on a Paramount Pictures soundstage to allow for additional camera angles. Also constructed was a magnificent hotel 'Governor's Suite,' replete with a panoramic view of the city provided by a lifesize backdrop precisely illustrating the view from the hotel's 35th floor.

The largest convention hotel in Los Angeles, the Westin Bonaventure occupies an entire city block and is bounded Fourth, Fifth, and Figueroa Streets on downtown's Bunker Hill. Since the hotel opened it's

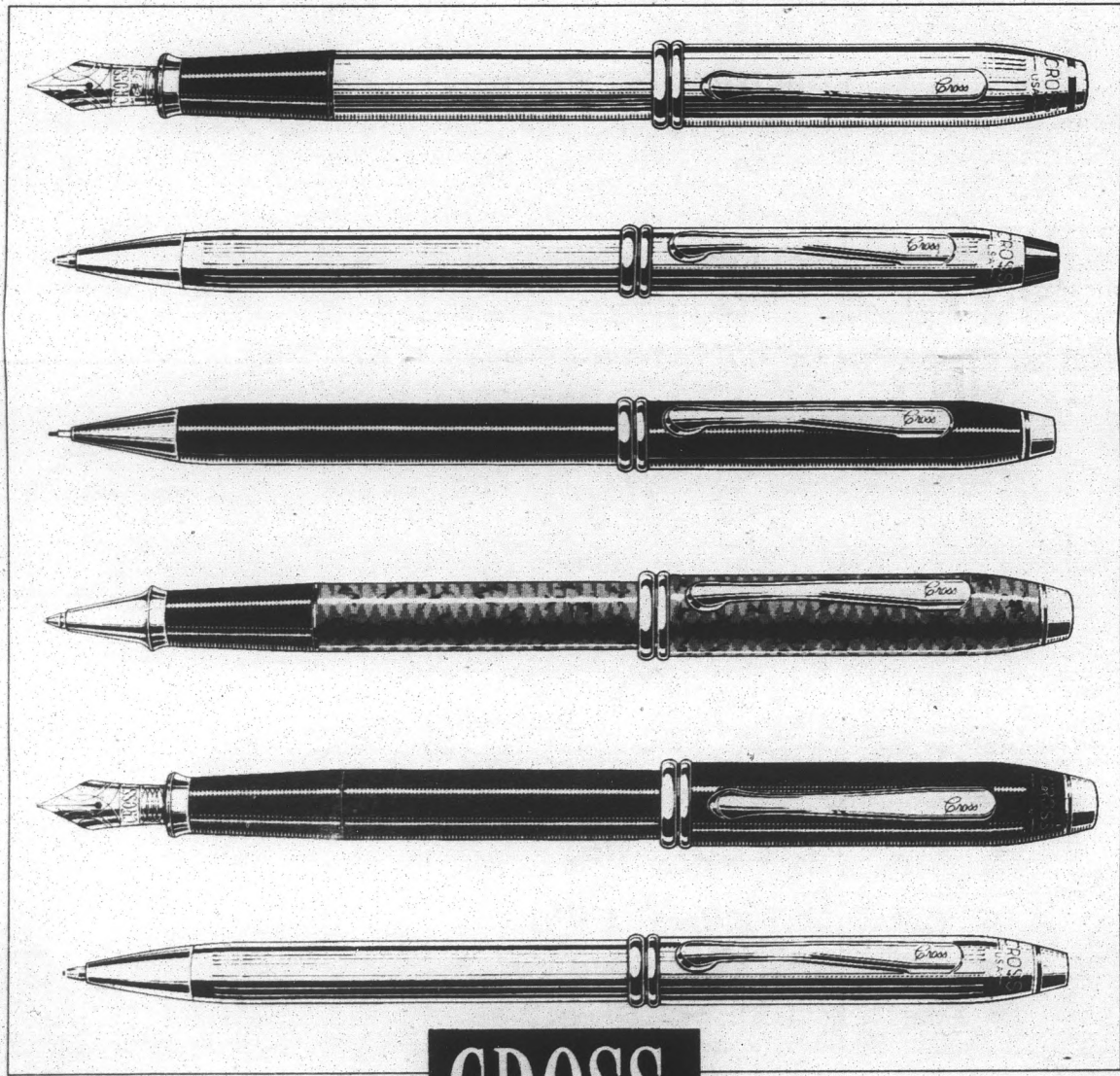
doors to the public in 1976, hit films that have lensed within the towering structure include "In the Line of Fire," "Rain Man" and "Lethal Weapon 2."

Union Station provided the setting for the opening sequences wherein Gene and his daughter are first noticed by Mr. Smith and Ms. Jones. The production crew filmed within a part of the building that is currently closed to the public, with Harrison and Julia Badham adding to this site a wrought iron catwalk designed in the same architectural mode as the station, an arrival/departure board with functioning clock, and a European-style lobby cafe. Says Harrison, "You would never notice the additions aren't part of the original design."

The cast and crew also filmed on the tracks for several days, using an actual Amtrak train that arrived and departed on cue. Union Station was declared a historic landmark in 1972. It was constructed in 1933 when three of the nation's railroads—Southern Pacific, Santa Fe and Union Pacific—pooled their resources.

Each sequence of "Nick of Time" was precisely timed within the set-ups for the cutting room. Editor Frank Morriss (Academy Award nominee for "Blue Thunder" and "Romancing the Stone") remarks, "I've never done anything like this before. Fortunately, John mapped it all out in his head. He had created a film that is frenetic in pace and constantly moving."

Stretching it out

No matter how active-or inactive - you may be, experts say stretching should be a regular part of your day.

Unlike other forms of exercise, stretching is peaceful, relaxing and noncompetitive. And best of all, it can be done any time, any place - at work, in the car, while waiting for a bus or train, or watching TV.

When done correctly, stretching reduces muscular tension, enhances flexibility, promotes circulation and prevents injuries such as muscle strain. You do not need to be in tip top shape to stretch, but you do need to take it slowly, particularly in the beginning. Give your body

and mind time to adjust to the stresses of physical activity.

There is a right way and a wrong way to stretch. Many people tend to bounce up and down or to stretch to the point of pain. This can actually do more harm than good.

Stretching should be done slowly and easily. Stretch to the point where you feel mild tension, and relax as you hold the stretch. The feeling of tension should subside as you hold the position. If it doesn't, ease off slightly until you find a comfortable tension. The goal of stretching is not to see how far you can go but to gradually increase your flexibility.

ATHLETIC SHOES

Choices, choices, choices! Air this, Shaq that, gel here, pressurized gas there. How does the average Joe without a degree in biomechanics figure out what athletic shoe to buy?

The decision-making process can actually be reduced to two simple steps.

Step 1: What will you be doing in your shoes? The beauty of today's highly specialized shoe market is that you can find a shoe that is precisely designed for almost every athletic activity. The benefits to the consumer are increased comfort and less chance of injury.

Step 2: As a political strategist might say, "It's the fit, stupid." Try on lots of different models and pick the one that best fits your foot.

For \$70 to \$120 you can find a stable, well-cushioned running shoe that will be perfect for your foot. Now you can buy models that prevent supination (shoe tends to wear on the outside of the sole) or overpronation (foot rolls in too much).

Even if you're not going to buy running shoes, you should walk into the running section and pick up one of today's high-tech specials—their lightness (as low as 11 ounces for the Asics Gel-Exult) will amaze you.

Basketball shoe prices are very steep, but there are always discounts on the previous year's models. The new king of the marketing hill, the Reebok Shaq Attack was actually the worst performer in a *Zillions* magazine performance test of evaporation rate and weight.

Despite Michael Jordan's retirement, Nike still features Air Jordans at the top of their basketball line. New York Knicks superstar Patrick Ewing has his own company (Ewing Athletic) and

sells his shoes at more affordable prices.

Cross-trainers make sense if you mix up your workouts. However, if you spend more than half your time doing one particular activity, you are better off just getting the shoe designed for that particular pursuit. Cross-trainers usually feature great lateral support but don't have the cushioning and stability of the sport-specific models.

Athletic shoes are not only functional; they're frequently fashionable. Converse and Puma are two companies that have aggressively pursued this market. Puma has re-released the suede "Clyde" and leather "Basket" models that were originally popular in the early '70s, while the classic Converse Chuck Taylor basketball sneaker is an urban style-setter, coming in many exotic designs.

If you take aerobics classes twice a week, you should definitely purchase specially designed aerobic shoes (Avia, Brooks and Reebok are the industry leaders). Wide-heeled running shoes will trip you up, and cross-trainers don't have enough cushioning. When choosing an aerobics shoe, look for lateral support and a smooth area on the balls of your feet for pivoting.

Yes, walking. Research has shown that walkers need shoes with lower heels than runners (Nike Air HealthWalker Plus), while race walkers need a thinner, more flexible midsole (Reebok Limbo). As this paper went to press there was still no word on a sitting shoe, specially designed for repeatedly crossing your legs.

Catalogs can simplify your holiday shopping

(NU)—Okay Santas, here's a quiz for savvy, smart shoppers. You'll have plenty of time to think about the answers as you lounge in the comfort of your own home.

Q: Name a shopping spot where you can browse as long as you want, knowledgeable sales representatives are waiting to help and you can purchase gifts for the holidays 24 hours a day.

A: Your living room.

All you need is your favorite chair, a pencil and a stack of mail-order catalogs. Chances are you'll find the perfect present for everyone on your list—from consumer electronics and toys to home furnishings, the latest kitchen gadgets and gourmet food.

Q: What percentage of adult population shops by mail?

A: More than half, or 52.6 percent, according to the Direct Marketing Association.

In 1993, 97.7 million people ordered merchandise by mail or phone. Catalog revenues totaled \$53.4 billion in 1993 and could reach \$69.5 billion in 1997.

Q: What's the deadline for holiday orders?

A: Dec. 23, for many catalog companies.

Most have overnight delivery, offer monogramming services and will send your gift, wrapped in holiday paper, to the recipient's home. If your present turns out to be less than perfect, almost all catalog companies have 100 percent guarantees.

Q: Where do you find shop-at-home catalogs?

A: One easy way to get started is to request the Direct Marketing Association's Great Catalog Guide. The colorful, 32-page handbook features nearly 200 catalogs in 50 categories.

Each listing includes the company's address, telephone order and customer service numbers, a description of merchandise and services and guarantee policy.

For a copy, send \$3 check or money order to the Direct Marketing Association, 1101 17th St. NW, Suite 705, Washington, DC 20036-4704.

Q: Where do you find tips on catalog shopping?

A: Ask the Direct Marketing Association.

In addition to the Great Catalog Guide, the organization publishes several helpful booklets, including "Tips for Telephone Shopping," available in English, Spanish, Korean, Vietnamese, Japanese and Chinese.

Here are a few tips to ensure a smooth transaction when shopping by phone.

- Check the company's satisfaction and return policies before ordering. Product warranties can be obtained before ordering. Simply ask.

- Save time by having ready, before you call, such information as merchandise order number and description, name and shipping address, and your charge account number.

- Keep a record of your order until you receive the product or have used the service. Retain the company name, address and phone number and a record of payments you have made.

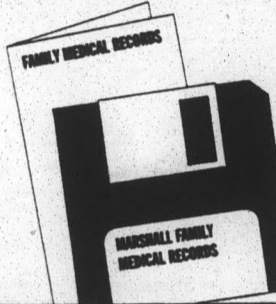
HEALTH WATCH

Make and carry a family medical record card

Be ready for emergency calls with a family medical record card that you can keep in your purse or wallet. While you are at it, make a floppy disk record of family medical records and keep one at home and one at work.

Things to include on the card:

- Family member's name, birth date, Social Security number, HMO medical record number
- Family physicians' and dentists' names, addresses and telephone numbers
- Illness and immunization history
- Allergies and blood types
- Medications being taken
- Broken bones, childhood illnesses, hospitalizations, etc.
- Relatives' telephone numbers.

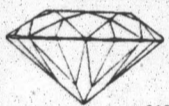

WRAP IT RIGHT BEFORE YOU SHIP IT

(NAPS)—Since you've taken the time to choose the perfect holiday gift, why not take a few more minutes to ensure that it arrives safely by wrapping and addressing it correctly? Follow these helpful tips from the U.S. Postal Service throughout the year to make sure your packages are delivered to the correct address, on time and in good shape:

- Select a container strong enough to protect the contents during handling. Fiberboard containers are generally strong enough to ship most materials. Your local post office offers packaging products designed for safe and sound delivery.

- Leave space inside the carton for cushioning. The container should have enough space to hold the contents plus cushioning to prevent damage. Leakproof containers and mailing materials should be used if shipping liquids.

Items which have an odor should be placed in a container which is impermeable to the contents.

- Prevent contents from shifting, and absorb shock by using good cushioning materials such as polystyrene, shredded or rolled newspapers, bubble plastic and fiberboard inserts.

- Used reinforced tape—don't use twine and cord; they tend to catch and bind in mail processing equipment.

- Mark the address and the zip code clearly and make special markings to alert the Postal Service to packages that are fragile or should not bend. If you are shipping framed photographs, it is a good idea to remove the glass and wrap it separately.

- Include a return address label inside the package prior to wrapping and sending.

Work with your doctor

To get the best health care, you must work with your doctor. No one cares more about you than you do, so don't be afraid to be your own advocate. You can make a healthful difference.

First things first: You should trust and respect your doctor. If you don't, find a new physician.

"Patients shouldn't tolerate what they see as high-handed or inconsiderate behavior on the part of a doctor—long waits, rushed consultations, perfunctory examinations. Nor should they tolerate a condescending or authoritarian attitude," advises Dr. Marvin M. Lipman, Consumers Union chief medical adviser and author of the "Office Visit" columns that appear regularly in *Consumer Reports*.

"Consumer Reports Health Answer Book: 300 Questions You've Always Wanted To Ask Your Doctor" (Consumer Reports Books) reprints several of Lipman's columns on the topic of working with your doctor.

To find a new physician when you need one, Lipman suggests that you ask a health-care professional—a doctor, nurse or technician—or your local hospital for recommendations.

Once you have a doctor working for you, become an active, not passive, patient. Ask for explanations and don't worry that you will annoy your physician.

"You've come to the office to care for your health, not to please your doctor," says Lipman.

Write down your questions before you get to the appointment. Also ask for written information about your disorder, or read about it at the library.

"The more you know, the more intelligently you're apt to follow—or question—your doctor's advice."

And don't be reluctant to speak up if you're experiencing unexpected side effects from a drug your doctor prescribed or if you simply need more

information. In a study conducted at Boston's New England Medical Center, "patients who were urged to be more assertive obtained more information from their doctors. More important, (they) had significantly better outcomes."

Lipman also espouses seeking second opinions particular when you're faced with surgical procedures. Second opinions may also make good sense whenever you feel uncertain about a recommended course of treatment. The physician recommends that you get a second opinion from an expert or specialist recommended to you by your primary-care physician or from the chief of surgery at a local hospital.

"Active, outspoken patients who ask for explanations seek information and aren't reluctant to get second opinions are usually less afraid of their disease and more determined to fight it," concludes Lipman. "And they do indeed seem to do better than their passive counterparts."

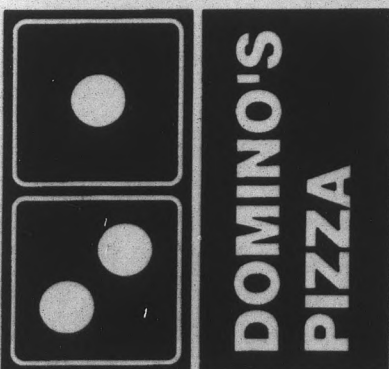

Get in shape for the ski season

Don't just sit idly dreaming about skiing—hot chocolate in hand—as you count down the weeks until that first ski trip.

Instead, use this time to get in shape for the best season yet.

After all, alpine—or downhill skiing—is a physically demanding sport requiring agility, speed, strength and endurance. Take the time to become fit now, and it's bound to show in your performance later. With proper conditioning, most skiers are better able to ski at a higher skill level more efficiently and with less fatigue, and possess more of the strength and endurance needed to handle challenging hills and valleys.

Those who take the time to get into prime shape before strapping on their skis also seem to enjoy their sport more, and—most importantly—they greatly reduce their risk of injury.

How much time should one devote to a preseason conditioning plan? While the answer depends largely on the skier, his or her present level of fitness and goals, conditioning programs generally run from three to five days a week, six to 12 weeks prior to the first day on the slopes.

That said, following are some ways to prepare for the chills and thrills that lie ahead.

By becoming aerobically fit during the pre-ski season, you'll build vital strength and endurance.

When the time arrives to hit the hill, you'll probably find that you're less tired, more tolerant of the cold alpine

temperatures and suffer fewer injuries.

The reason? A good aerobics program will not only help increase your heart and circulatory system's ability to deliver oxygen rich blood to your muscles during exercise but will also increase your muscles' ability to use that oxygen. In other words, your body becomes a more efficient ski machine.

With aerobic activity, skiers have many choices. Running, cycling, in-line roller skating, step aerobics and working out on the cross-country or stair-stepping machine are among the top workout picks.

Before you start pounding out the miles and elevating that heart rate, however, determine your present level of aerobic fitness. Then embark on a safe yet sane program that contains the right mix of the three aerobic fundamentals: intensity, duration and frequency.

To come up with a regimen that's right for you, consult a personal trainer, enroll in an aerobics class taught by a qualified instructor or read up on the subject through books and magazines that offer in-depth coverage of ski or aerobic fitness.

To meet the physical demands of skiing, you'll also need muscular strength—especially in the abdomen, back and legs.

The best strategy for strengthening muscles is to work out with free weights or a weight machine—perhaps at a health club or within the confines of your own home gym. Determine load and repetitions with the help of a

Protect yourself against credit card fraud

(NAPS)-Credit card fraud is a growing threat to consumers and business alike. In 1992, for example, credit card issuers' losses due to fraud were more than \$860 million.

You can become a victim of credit fraud through seemingly normal credit card use. Perhaps someone has been able to get your account number from a charge slip, or you've given the account number and other personal data to someone over the phone who misled you into thinking you were ordering a product from a legitimate business. Such information can then be used to apply for credit in your name and without your knowledge.

Here are some things you can do to protect your-

self from credit fraud:

- Be careful in giving out account numbers and other personal information.
 - Check your monthly credit card statements carefully for unauthorized charges.
 - Occasionally request a copy of your credit report from a national credit rating agency such as Equifax, TRW or TransUnion. Such a checkup should reveal if anyone has applied for credit in your name or whether any accounts are being used without your knowledge, with the billing statement being sent to a different address.
- If you believe you are a victim of credit fraud:
- Immediately notify your credit grantors.
 - Contact the credit reporting agencies to alert

them of possible fraudulent accounts or unauthorized charges. Equifax's Fraud Assistance Unit receives over 200 phone calls and letters each day from consumers who believe they have been victimized by credit fraud. The company works with consumers and credit grantors to remove fraudulent accounts or charges and places a fraud statement on the consumer's credit file to warn credit grantors accessing the file in the future that credit applications need to be verified by phone with the consumer to ensure legitimacy.

Guard your credit carefully. It can be stolen from you like any other valuable property—and can be just as difficult to get back.

personal trainer or ski fitness expert.

There are, however, some exercises you can do using your own body resistance. Two from *American Health* magazine include:

- Toe stand, to strengthen your calves, which assist with balance: Stand on your left foot and lift up onto your tiptoes. Slowly lower your heel to the floor. Do 25 times. Reverse legs.

- Balance squat, to strengthen hamstrings and protect knees: Stand with your back facing a chair. Lift your right leg up behind you and rest it on the chair. Keeping your back erect, slowly bend your left knee and lower your body until your thigh is nearly parallel to the ground. Return to starting position. Do 15 times. Reverse legs.

You may not be able to work on your turns and traverses just yet. But through cross-training, plenty of other sports can help prepare you for the ski season.

Sports such as in-line roller skating, tennis, mountain biking and ice skating will not only improve aerobic ability and coordination, but they also share some of the same essential motion patterns that skiing employs.

Thus when you participate in any of these sports, you can get in a little dry-land practice that will benefit you on the hill later on if you become aware of the common movements, then work to perfect your execution and performance.

Then, when ski season rolls around, you'll be friendly and familiar with the twists, turns, arm lifts and bends because you've already worked on them.

Another idea lies in hitting the downhill ski machine at your health club or purchasing one for home use.

Perhaps the next best thing to skis themselves, these machines allow you to simulate the knee flexing and turning motion of alpine skiing in the great indoors.

Whether it's a tape of hot-doggers

jumping off a cliff or a tome that explains and illustrates skiing basics, skiing reads and videos can help prepare you for your sport during the off-season.

For advice on how to perform or improve a particular skiing technique, turn to an instructional video, book or magazine. Oftentimes, particular moves are illustrated in frame-by-frame style and accompanied by well-written descriptions, so you can actually see the action that you miss while trying to mimic the moves of an excerpt on the hill.

The same resources can give you all the lowdown regarding subjects such as warming up before taking your first run of the day, developing flexibility for improved performance and mentally preparing yourself for the slopes.

If it's inspiration you're after, pop a video of a ski race or exhibition in the VCR. Not only will you be awe-struck and highly entertained, but you'll probably gain a tip or two as you watch the pros.

Another way to gear up for the season ahead is by watching a videotape of yourself shot during last year's final ski trip. Since you'll see the good, the bad and the ugly, you'll know what you need to work on in the coming season.

Besides getting physically fit, there are dozens of armchair preparations you can make before the downhill season arrives.

Enroll in ski school or join a ski club now—before the last-minute rush—and have your bindings cleaned and checked and skis waxed and repaired so that all your equipment is in top condition for opening day.

If you'll be skiing at a new resort this year, now's the time to browse through guidebooks and brochures to get an idea of the runs that fall within your skill level.

It's also a good idea to try on all your ski clothing and gear, so that you can purchase what you need at the pre-season ski sales and swaps.

Finally, when the time arrives to slide into the chair to the top and hit the hill, don't overdo it.

Even those in peak condition need to

take frequent breaks because fatigued skiers are the ones who are most frequently injured.

During a day of skiing, be sure to stop for a meal, snacks and plenty of fluids. And if you are embarking on a slope-side vacation, make sure you take a day off after several on the hill.

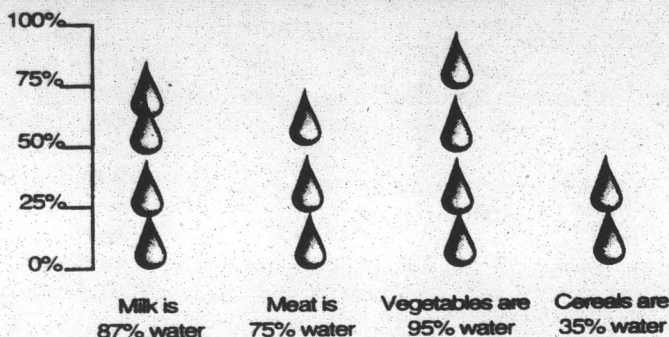

HOW TO SPEND LESS AND LOOK BETTER

If you're one of those people who open their bulging closets every morning and groan that they have nothing to wear, it might be time to pick up Tori Hartman's "Fabulous You" (Berkley Books). Subtitled "Unlock Your Perfect Personal Style," the book provides logical steps toward developing pizzazz and flair in your wardrobe while actually spending less than you might have in the past.

"What I found was that people naturally had a style but they wasted a lot of time and a lot of money buying what I call 'experiments'" she said in a recent interview. "This book is just a cost-effective way of helping women who don't earn a ton of money put looks together. I'm very good at making things simple: Does this suit your lifestyle or doesn't it?"

The basis of Hartman's plan is a lifestyle wheel on which she places six basic types: sporty, romantic, traditional, classic, dramatic and trendy. A famous sporty, for example, is Chris Evert. Romantics are Carly Simon and Jane Seymour; traditionals are Hillary Clinton and Angela Lansbury. Audrey Hepburn and Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis were textbook classics; Elizabeth Taylor and Diana Ross are dramatics. Madonna is the ultimate trendy.

If you're not certain what your type is, Hartman offers a lifestyle quiz to help you figure it out. Questions include "How long do you keep friends?", "How and where would you most like to live?" and "What in our life are you most passionate about?"

Each section contains a profile of the particular type, suggestions for basic wardrobe components and a shopping list of designers who cater to that lifestyle. A classic, for instance, will concentrate on career clothiers and designers such as Anne Klein and Ellen Tracy. Traditionals, on the other hand, are more likely to shop from an L.L. Bean catalog.

She wraps up with sections on what colors to wear and which accessories to choose (traditionals often wear scarves; romantics are likely to carry cloth or woven bags). And she includes some tips that all types can use: Large earrings take off 5 pounds visually. Wear a pin on your lapel if you're shortwaisted. Build your entire wardrobe around three basic colors. The book offers practical advice on

cleaning out your closet and swapping clothes with friends so that everybody ends up with her best look. And Hartman sprinkles her chapters with humorous but sound tips - such as to keep one fabulous "fat day" outfit and to cut out the size tags you find offensive instead of beating yourself up about being overweight.

"I'm a classic," she said, "but in my closet I have some dramatic pieces. We try to be something we're not. Those are the clothes we've paid too much money for, but we can't wear them anywhere. The traditional woman secretly wishes she were more of a career woman. She always reaches for suits, but she needs pieces that work with her lifestyle."

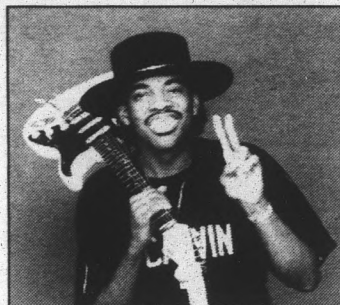

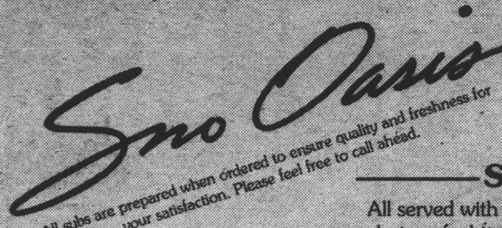

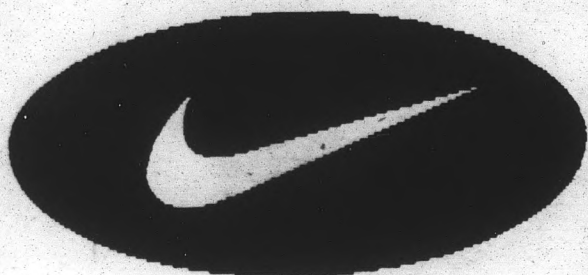
