WHAT GOES IN THE BIN AT CGS?




Landfill




Bags
Even if bags have visible numbers for plastic recycling




Glass
Glass materials should go in the landfill at SRP




Evil Hybrids
Beverage cups with wax lining; Food wrappers or chip bags; K-Cups




Recycle




Plastic
All hard plastics with visible number; Keep caps on bottles




Aluminum
Aluminum beverage cans; Aluminum soup cans



Paper
Paper documents should be shredded if they have confidential information. Also magazines, newspaper, window envelopes and file folders.



Cardboard



Cardboard
Flatten your cardboard boxes and place them in the designated bins around the plant.

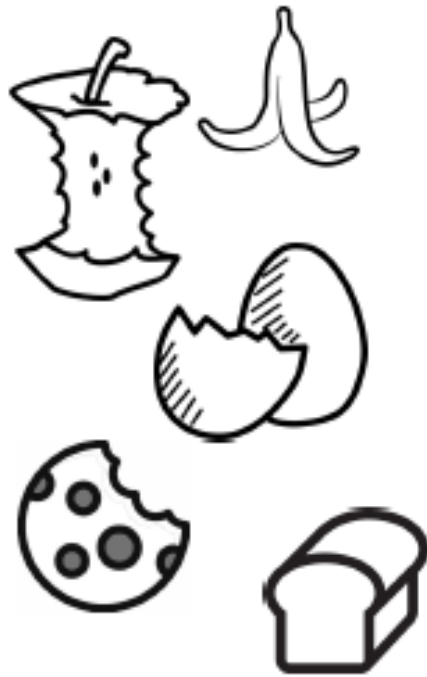

COMPOSTING

Compost bins in break rooms can accept the following:



- Fruit and veggie scraps
- Pasta, bread, and grains
- Coffee grounds and filters
- Tea bags
- Nut and egg shells
- Meat and fish (yes, bones too!)
- Candy, cookies, and cake

- Herbs & spices
- Paper napkins and plates (not Dixie)
- Paper towels and the roll
- Tissues
- Compostable cups
- Dairy
- Compostable utensils

The Bring Your Own Bottle Challenge

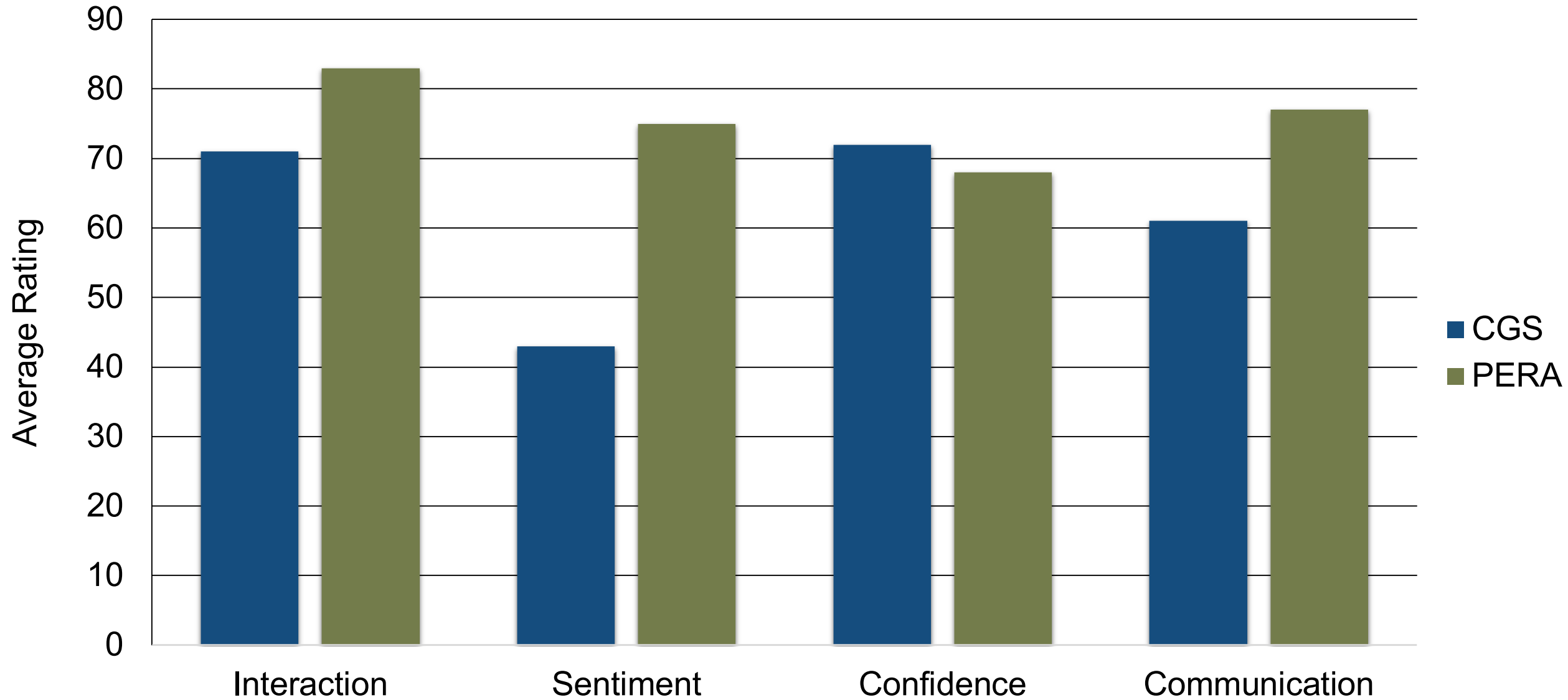


- 1 facility pledge = 336 bottles a day
